

# Year 3 - Autumn 2017

## English

### ☐ Fables

Read a variety of fables, looking at the techniques and considering what a moral is. Look in depth at a fable then create our own fables.

### ☐ Stories

Explore adjectives and adverbs, practise using them to write descriptions, then plan and write a story based on a familiar setting.

### ☐ Reports

Explore a range of non-fiction information sources to help create a report page about a dragon.

### ☐ Biographies

Explore what a biography is; looking at the different style of writing. Read a selection of biographies, then use our knowledge to create a biography of Mary Anning.

### ☐ Poetry

Creating poetry with reflection on the summer and its themes.

## Mathematics

We will be covering: place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. Through these areas we will be developing fluency, reasoning and problem solving skills.

## ICT

### ☐ Using Word

Refine your Word skills, improving your speed of typing as well as using clip art and inserting pictures from other sources.

### ☐ Internet Searching

Learn how to navigate the Internet safely, searching for images. Copy and paste these into Word documents; then create a poster

## Topic

### ☐ The Continents

Develop your understanding of the world map through a careful study of the world's continents and oceans.

### ☐ Britain

Learn what Britain, the United Kingdom and Great Britain refer to, considering the countries within the UK. Look at the identities (flags, saints) of the countries as well as some of the famous landmarks.

- Use your geographical and Ordnance Survey skills to read maps and locate places within the UK.

- Learn which counties make up England, looking at the ones neighbouring Surrey in particular.

- Study the topography of various areas within the UK looking at what makes them unique and identifying where they are on a map.

- Locate, name and identify some of the major cities within the UK.

## Music

### ☐ Musical Elements

Learn about some of the musical elements—pitch, dynamics, tempo and duration. We will find out how these are used to make music interesting.

### ☐ Music from other cultures

Explore aspects of African drumming music, compose and perform your own piece of African music and sing songs from Africa or about Africa.

### ☐ Batik

Learn a new technique to produce an effective design based on a British artist.

### ☐ What do Christians believe God is like?

Explore who God is and what we already know about him. Look at how God is perceived in the Bible.

### ☐ How does the Bible reveal God's plan?

Using the Bible, read stories about God, discussing his plan.

## Science

### ☐ Magnets and Springs

Explore magnets, magnetic materials and consider how magnets work. Look closely at springs and their uses, investigating elasticity and stretch.

### ☐ Rocks and Soils

Investigating different types of rocks and soils. Learn how fossils are created.
