
Homework

- We will be using a range of texts to cover different purposes for writing.
 These include: Wolf Brother, The Twits, The Snowman, a range of Greek myths and remembrance poems.
- Homework is set on a Monday and will alternate between grammar and a reading comprehension. This is due in on Monday. Creative writing will be set once a half term. Homework can be found on the school website.
- Spellings are introduced in class on a Monday in Guided Reading. A list for learning is sent home each week and then tested on the Monday (fortnightly).



Reading



- Reading will be an activity taking place at home and in school.
- It is extremely important that you listen to your child as often as
 possible and record this in their homework diary. A combination of
 reading independently <u>and</u> to an adult is necessary to ensure depth of
 understanding is achieved.
- Focused comprehension activities will take place during Guided Reading sessions, as well as spelling reinforcement, phonics, grammar and punctuation tasks.
- The Reading Ramble is a good opportunity to share reading experiences together.


ILTs




- There will be one ILT set in the summer term. This will be based on our WW2 topic and how members of our family were affected.
