On 26th April, we had a visit from Douglas Alexander of Wildlife Aid in Leatherhead. He spoke to the children about their i Dot programme. This stands for I Do One Thing, a simple action you can do everyday to help wildlife. If we all do one thing, this can have a big impact on the environment. He made the following suggestions:

1. Always put litter in the bin, making sure you crush cans.
2. Build log piles and leaf piles to create new habitats.
3. If you ever find an animal that has been trapped or hurt, call Wildlife Aid Foundation.
4. Plant wild flowers to encourage pollination in your garden.
5. Always hang up football nets when you are finished playing with them.
6. Always check garden or school fences for trapped animals.

These are certainly things we will be thinking of as we develop our school grounds in the next few years. Please try to think of them at home too.
