Safeguarding at Queen Eleanor's CofE Junior School is given top priority. All adults in our school have a responsibility for Safeguarding.

These staff have both completed Intermediate Level Safeguarding Training or higher, led by the LSCB (Local Safeguarding Children Board). They complete further training every year.

All staff (teachers, teaching assistants, midday assistants, admin staff and the site manager) have completed Basic Awareness of Safeguarding Training. The most recent whole staff training took place in September 2021. Those staff who were not able to attend this training or have joined the school since this date have completed similar training programmes.

The named Local Committee Member for Safeguarding is **Mrs Alexa Robertson**

All staff recruitment panels include at least one person who has completed appropriate 'Safer Recruitment in Education' training.

All adults (staff and visitors) in school are required to wear a Queen Eleanor's CofE Junior School visitor's badge which contains key safeguarding information, and must sign in at the school office, where there is access to a safeguarding notice.

All staff, governors, students and volunteers undertake a DBS check and staff DBS details are kept in a Single Central Record in school.

The Safeguarding Policy (and related policies) form a central part of the Staff Induction process, and all of these policies are reviewed annually.

We believe that it is important to make children and young people aware of behaviour towards them that is not acceptable and our broad and balanced curriculum supports children in recognising when their personal safety is being compromised.

The school also signposts access to support for pupils, by displaying Childline posters and contact telephone number.

We are committed to multi-agency working, in order to ensure the best possible outcomes for all of the pupils at Queen Eleanor's.
